About Beta Chi

The Beta Chi Chapter was originally founded on September 23, 1950 and was active until 1962, when the University's marching band program shut down after a decade of hardships. Without a marching band to serve, the chapter was unable to meet its goals and was disbanded. Over 40 years later, Carl and Hunter Smith donated enough money to establish the Cavalier Marching Band at UVA. With new instruments, uniforms, and spirit, the new marching band took to the field for its premier performance September 11th, 2004.

The Beta Chi Chapter was re-founded on April 23, 2005 with the help of our Big Brother Chapter, Eta Omicron of JMU. Today, Beta Chi provides support to the Cavalier Marching Band and other ensembles in the Charlottesville community. As the oldest active chapter in the Southern Precinct, Beta Chi has welcomed over 250 well-qualified musicians into the Brotherhood of Kappa Kappa Psi.

Who is Kappa Kappa Psi?

Kappa Kappa Psi was founded in 1919 at Oklahoma State University as a National Honorary Society for College Bandsmen. Bohumil Makovsky, was the Band Director at Oklahoma State University, and came together with 10 of his students to create a fraternal organization based around their shared love of music. Since then, the fraternity has expanded to over 300 chapters and 50,000 Brothers in universities across the nation. Kappa Kappa Psi focuses on supporting college and university bands as well fostering responsibility, loyalty, and leadership in each member. Members focus on fulfilling the motto: "Strive for the Highest."

I even took pictures during MC voting. A look into the secretive process.




Lara and I spent time together doing miscellaneous things like going to Target and going through EVERY aisle and going to Barnes and Noble and looking at all the fun books!


I went to the Concert Band performance towards the end of this past semester with the main goal of supporting my friends in the ensemble. It was towards the end of April and I was majorly stressed with papers


